

Klitschko's biggest fight yet – taking on the Covid deniers

Former champ turned mayor of Kiev tells

Matt Dickinson
how he is coping with pandemic



No fight of Vitali Klitschko's life can compare to the one that he has been waging on Covid-19 as mayor of Kiev.

Responsibility has never weighed on him as heavily as these past weeks and months when he has been grappling, like so many politicians, with an unprecedented crisis.

The former world heavyweight champion is now a politician of considerable stature in Ukraine, running a city of around three million people, and he feels the burden of leadership as he enacts policy to fight coronavirus.

"Believe me, every day I get up concerned, with countless worries," he says. "What else can be done to handle the crisis? Would our hospitals cope? Would there be enough medical staff to deal with the critical situation? How fast will the economy recover? How many infrastructure projects will we be able to finish during the crisis?"

Klitschko, 48, once said that "it's much easier to be the heavyweight champion of the world than to be the mayor."

Because [in politics] there are no rules. It's hitting you in the back. It's hitting you under the belt line." And that was before he was fighting the unseesable foe of Covid-19.

It is a challenge made harder, he says, by those in Ukraine who think that the rules do not apply to them, or that the disease is somehow fictitious. "We still have to overcome the hard resistance of some people who think that coronavirus is a hoax," he says. "They believe they can't be affected. Others prefer a global conspiracy theory." These "conspiracies and myths", he says with frustration, undermine trust, not only in medical expertise but in politicians too.

Almost eight years since the last of Klitschko's fights to successfully defend his WBC world title, the scale of the crisis means that he is reluctant to reflect on those days when "Dr Ironfist", with his PhD in sport science, built a formidable record of 45 wins and

two losses (including 41 stoppages). Perhaps the most famous of those fights was his defeat by Lennox Lewis in Los Angeles in 2003. Klitschko was ahead on points when the bout was stopped after six rounds because of damage to his eye. Lewis was jeered in victory and would not fight again.

Klitschko would dominate the division with Wladimir, his younger brother, for four years, but they suffered for lack of drama and high-quality opponents. Now the heavyweight scene is enthralling but he sidesteps the question of who is the best out of Tyson Fury, Anthony Joshua and Deontay Wilder.

His attention must be on the virus in a city which happens to be twinned with Wuhan, where Covid-19 originated. Communication with medics in China was helpful, he says, in preparing the response and in keeping the fatality rate below the national average of around 3 per cent of infected cases across Ukraine, with 69 deaths in his city from 3,133 cases. He says early measures "for which we have faced a lot of criticism" saved lives.

A taskforce was in operation from late January to establish dedicated medical facilities and stockpile equipment. Social restrictions were put in place in mid-March and have only recently been eased.

"This is my firm belief that the prompt restrictions were instrumental in slowing the spread of the disease," he says. "Otherwise, the situation could have looked different."

modern European capital. He remains ambitious for his city and his country.

He could have retired on the millions earned through boxing but was drawn to politics, first standing for mayor in 2006, in the belief that there was still much to be done to modernise his country despite the fall of the Iron Curtain in 1991. More than a decade later, he felt nothing had changed.

"There's a saying I like very much,"

prefer "Kyiv" because "Kiev" is how it is pronounced in Russian and a highly sensitive issue. It is where he had his first paying job as a teenager leading tourists on trips through the capital.

In the city which hosted Liverpool's defeat by Real Madrid in the 2018 Champions League final, he insists that he has overhauled a "corrupt and inefficient" management system to upgrade transport, hospitals and schools and try to turn it into a

the question but says that his party will be pushing hard in local elections later this year, and that he still hopes for further integration between Ukraine and Europe.

"For six years now Ukraine has been opposing Russian aggression to defend its independence and European choice," he says.

He talks of Russia "preying on controversies in Europe" to destabilise the EU and a "permanent threat to Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity" from Russia's military might.

Perhaps he will address those matters on a national scale one day but, for now, his concerns are closer to home.

"Never before in our recent history have Kiev, Ukraine and many countries across the globe seen a threat of such danger and scale," he says. "This is why I am never getting tired of urging Kyivans to take the infection seriously."

"Now while Kiev is loosening the restrictions, I am anxious about the infection dynamics. As mayor of the city, I am responsible for everything that happens here. The responsibility is huge, especially now, during the crisis."

Klitschko showed plenty of staying power as a boxer, a heavyweight champion who held the title in three different decades, and he insists that he is in it for the long haul as a politician.

"Believe me, a mayor of a city with a four million population has an enormous workload," he says. "And still more needs to be done."

Boulder learning from housemate Robson and taking care of elderly

It is around this time of year that Katie Boulter would normally start gearing up for Wimbledon with practice sessions on the grass, matches at warm-up tournaments and a string of media and sponsor commitments.

This June, however, looks very different for the British Fed Cup player. With the sport's summer showpiece cancelled for the first time since the Second World War and the international tours suspended until August at the earliest, the 23-year-old has decided to fill her time by becoming a voluntary befriender for the Age UK charity.

Starting yesterday, Boulter's new role involves her developing friendships with elderly people near her London apartment. In an effort to quell the loneliness of those who are socially isolated and housebound, she will offer conversation and assistance, whether it be over the telephone or in-person outdoors at a safe distance.

"I get to go and visit people and have a relationship with elderly people," Boulter said. "I can try and help them during this difficult time. Age UK pairs you with up to three people. You can go and see them, talk to them over the phone, go and do their shopping for them and basically just try and help make their lives a little bit easier."

The motivation for Boulter to sign up with Age UK comes through the lack of face-to-face contact with elderly members of her Leicester-based family in recent months. She has particularly missed the company of her 84-year-old inventor grandfather, Brian Gartshore, whose finest

creation was anti-theft tags for clothes. "It's been pretty hard for me," Boulter said. "I am used to it because I'm travelling a lot and I don't always get to spend time with them, but to have an extended period where I am in the country and I can't go and see them makes it so much harder."

"For some who don't have people living with them, I am sure it has been an extremely tough period. If I can help in any way, then it makes me happy."

Boulter was not alone during the lockdown, sharing her apartment with fellow player Laura Robson and her boyfriend James Yates. "Laura was getting renovations done to her house, so she asked if she could stay," Boulter said. "I said yes and when I got back [from Indian Wells] it was straight into lockdown. I've been here with her and her boyfriend pretty much the whole time."

"Being around any professional player is very interesting to hear their point of view on things, and there's a lot you can learn. I have a lot of respect for her because she's persevered for a very long time with some tough injuries."

When the tour was suspended in March, Boulter was only a few tournaments into a comeback. A stress fracture in her back forced her off the court for six months last year, which was untimely having worked her way up the rankings to a career-high position of No 82. She has used the lockdown to build up her fitness. "It's been a valuable time and I've tried to use it in the best way possible" she said.
